New Ideas to share with the commissions:

- Collaborating within commissions like for example: Technology with Learning Resources.
- Sharing information available online, example: "The Atlantic's Ideas Stage is now live on our <u>YouTube</u> and <u>Facebook</u> pages. <u>Tune in now</u> to hear from some of the biggest voices shaping today's most pressing conversations."
- A job-oriented hub; every single day I receive offers based on my resume that I can share. It can be useful to students.
- As mentioned preparing for certifications like Adobe, it could be Microsoft, Google, etc. At MDC we have through CIOL faculty facilitating webinars for instance, Tommy Demos at MDC and/or another source, or we can have an open invitation throughout the 28 colleges.
- Continue to partnership with publishers and other vendors.
- Fundraising benefiting the Foundation like the Miami 2020 Fun-Raiser Miami Dade County and Exposition Fair benefiting the AFC Foundation which unfortunately, was cancelled due to the COVID-19 PANDEMIC.
- Circles is a perfect way to work in small groups, the problem with AFC Circles is the need to attract participants from other venues like commissions, regions, and chapters. It is the adding of the members as you cannot add members freely. It should be like Facebook is doing by invitation for a pool of members to accept or decline. AFC circles can be more project-oriented creating LEARNING CIRCLES with a goal in mind:
 - "A learning circle is a highly interactive, participatory structure for organizing group work. The goal is to build, share, and express knowledge though a process of open dialogue and deep reflection around issues or problems with a focus on a shared outcome. Online learning circles take advantage of social networking tools to manage collaborative work over distances following a timeline from the open to close of the circle. Circles have a final project which collects the shared knowledge generated during the interactions. Learning circles is a great way to organize learning in global projects and massively open online course (MOOCs)."
